At that time Aurangabad was the central place for the education. This reigon was very famous in historical period.

Ellora, Ajantha caves, Bibika Makbara and Pavan chakki these best examples. Aurangabad was the first educational centre of Hydrabad state. There were only 7 colleges in Hyadrabad state. Urdu was the main language of the state. Very few people were involved in the educational system. Godavari was the biggest river in Marathwada. The land, language, culture traditions were different in Hyderaba state. He also proposed that all the problems should be included in the primary and higher education. Then we could remove the educational problems. The problems in our region were not studied seriously. Education gives the knowledge of basic things. Education provides strength for survival the life. Those people who have lost the will of survival they come, to suicide. Dr. Satish Dandge delivered the presidential address. He said that engineering education was given through the Urdu medium; we have to study 'some basic questions about the education. Students volunteers should have to active for expansion of extension activities. Education should be continuous and skillful.
