Brief Report

Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University (BAMU) organized a Blood Donation Camp on its campus in Aurangabad, Maharashtra, on July 16, 2021. The event aimed to collect blood donations, raise awareness, and engage the community in a vital health initiative, especially in the wake of increased demand due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The camp also sought to educate students and the local community about the significance of blood donation in saving lives. Pre-Event Preparations included planning and coordination by a dedicated committee comprising university officials, medical staff, and student volunteers. Collaborations were established with local hospitals and blood banks to facilitate the collection and processing of donated blood. Publicity was promoted through various channels, including university notice boards, social media, local newspapers, and announcements in community centers, to encourage participation.

Glimpses from blood Donation Event Organized by General Administration of the University. The event was graced by the thoughful guidance of Honourable Vice Chancellor, Shri Rajendraji Dadrda and Shri Satisji Chawhan (political lumineries). Hon'ble Pro Vice Chancellor, Registrar and Management Council Members were present for the event

Student volunteers were recruited to assist in the organization and execution of the camp, including registration, donor assistance, and post-donation care. Logistics and setup were also crucial for the success of the camp. The university's main hall was selected as the venue, with arrangements for registration, waiting areas, donation stations, and postdonation refreshments. Medical equipment and supplies, such as blood collection kits, donor beds, and first aid, were arranged in collaboration with partner hospitals. Health and safety protocols were put in place to ensure compliance with COVID-19 safety guidelines, including temperature checks, social distancing, and the provision of hand sanitizers and masks. The event activities and implementation included an inauguration ceremony, where the Vice-Chancellor of Dr. BAMU highlighted the university's commitment to community service and the importance of blood donation. A guest speaker from the Blood Bank spoke about the critical need for blood donations and the positive impact of such initiatives. The blood donation process involved registration and health screening, with volunteers assisting donors with registration and medical staff conducting health screenings to check donor eligibility. Donation stations were set up, and donors were guided to designated donation stations where trained medical staff facilitated the blood collection process. Postdonation care involved providing refreshments and monitoring donors for their well-being. Educational and awareness activities were conducted, with information booths set up to provide educational materials about blood donation, its benefits, and how donated blood is used in medical treatments. Interactive sessions were conducted where healthcare professionals answered questions and dispelled myths about blood donation. Community interaction and feedback were also encouraged, with donors and participants sharing their

The event highlighted the university's commitment to social responsibility and community service, demonstrating the positive impact that educational institutions can have on public health and well-being.
