
Entrepreneurship Development Program, 25 February 2020

Report of the Event Prepared by IQAC in consultation with concerned Department:

The Department of Statistics at Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad, has been conducting an annual Bridge Course for first-year students from 2018-19 to 2022-23 to facilitate a smooth academic transition. The course aims to equip students with a fundamental understanding of key statistical concepts and techniques, bridge the knowledge gap for students from varied educational backgrounds, enhance their analytical skills, and boost their confidence.

The Bridge Course spans one to two weeks at the start of the academic year and includes basic statistical concepts, mathematical foundation, data analysis techniques, statistical software training, interactive sessions, assessment and feedback, and feedback sessions.
