 - The department of Life Long Learning & Extension Services organized several camps for students and society.
 - Extension Centres of the Department of Life Long Learning & Extension Services are
 active in 60 colleges affiliated to the University. These centres conduct personality
 development programs, guidance on communication skills in English, bio-data writing,
 entrepreneurship development and interaction with successful entrepreneurs for college
 students.
 - At the societal level, these 60 extension centres in various colleges conduct health camps and agricultural development related camps.
 - The department of Life Long Learning & Extension Services adopted a village named Kesapuri Tanda in Aurangabad district where the department organized health camp for villagers along with program to make people aware about the ill-effects of addiction. The department also organized a trip to Ralegan Siddhi-an ideal village - for young boys and girls from Kesaputi Tanda.
 - The department of Life & Long Learning & Extension Services organized a one day training for 60 principals, 60 teachers and 120 students on how to carry out extension activities.
 - At college level, several certificate courses (Aanganwadi, Balwadi, Library Management, Sales Representative, Dress Making & Designing, Communicative English and Rural Journalism) are conducted.
 - At the level of University, the Department offers Diploma in Community Based Rehabilitation and a Post Graduate Diploma in Adult & Continuing Education and Extension.
