

New Researches in History of Deccan

27th and 28th May, 2017

Venue: Seminar Hall-I, Department of History and Ancient Indian Culture

Concept Note: The history on Deccan in Indian history although carries rich legacy of history and heritage, but it lacks overall emphasis for understanding it as a centripetal and centrifugal narrative in Indian history. India's Deccan Plateau is in the relatively neglected historic scenario since 1000 B.C. till today. Indeed, despite the dominance of northern India in the study of ancient and medieval history as in the politics of the present, some of the finest works of recent decades on religious movements, visual cultures, and literary traditions pertaining to the ancient medieval and modern period are spatially located in southern and Deccan-Central India. The memories and monuments of earlier political achievements of the Satvanahas, Vakatakas, Chalukaya, Yadavas, Bahmani sultans and Mughals, including temples, relics, and city-gates, were used by Kings and Sultans of Ahmadnagar, Aurangabad, Bijapur, Golconda, Hyderabad etc. clearly identified themselves with an Indic or Sanskritic inheritance, but also adopted Persianate-markers such as distinctive titles and dress. Outsmarting their more resourceful rival, the Deccani Sultans also intelligently transcended the chasm between Persian-Islamic (including Shia-Sunni divide) and the Sanskritic cosmologies since — re-using Kakatiya antiques and yet creating something of their own. The power struggles: political and historical memory, architectural heritage, and military innovations, particularly the sophisticated water management, metallurgy, diamond and gold mine and new gunpowder technology. Later during colonial era this region came to be known for its fervor for freedom struggle and for carrying colonial legacy of urban and rural heritage. The inherent diverse and rich historic legacy of Deccan has inspired and motivated researches in various realms of history since ancient to modern. In the present era many more dimensions of inter-disciplinary and cross-cultural studies have come up as new researches in the history of Deccan. The proposed seminar will initiate discourses in the history of Deccan and discussion will be carried on new researches.

Themes and form of presentations: The seminar will broadly focus on presentation related to history of ancient, medieval and modern Deccan. There will be plenary sessions of delegates and paper reading session of young scholars.
